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Dear Mr. Lamb:

On your program last Friday, Mr. Bob Franken made two disparaging remarks about people whom he described as "homophobes." I cannot find the word in my Merriam Webster Seventh Collegiate, so it is necessary that I guess at its meaning. If the definition of a homophobe is:

"A person who believes that God made people man and woman with sexual equipment designed to complement each other in a committed relationship for the emotional well being of both parties and the continuation of the human species."

then I am a homophobe.

As a homophobe, I do not hate homosexuals, nor do I bash them, nor do I countenance other people bashing them. I prefer that they not exist as I believe their life style is sodomic.
