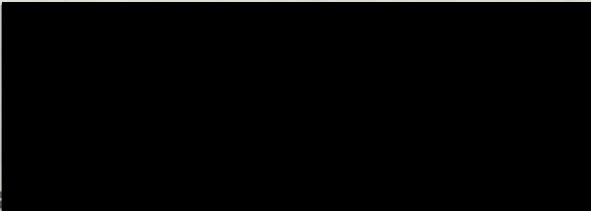
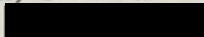
Greetings,

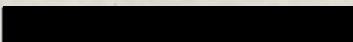
On April 4th I submitted a letter telling my reasons for watching C-Span. I have since noted on your station you ask that we include our telephone number.
