First, thank you for C-SPAN - I watch as much as I can.



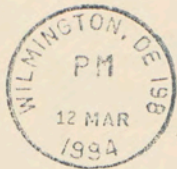
Finally, I suggest also that you, who do such fine interviews, interview all four men together. I would enjoy that very much and,
