The people, in whose hearts the spirit of 1776 is being rekindled by everything they see in Washington, will throw out of office every Senator and every Congressman who votes for this Tax Bill, the good along with the bad, when nothing gets any better in the next short fifteen months.

Congress should adopt the principal recommendation that Ross Perot made on the "Today" show on July 30: do nothing about this plan now, go home and get the opinions of the people during the August recess.

I'm certain that it should do one other thing: All 535 members should ask their people this question: "Article 1 Section 8 of the Constitution says that Congress shall have the power to provide for the general welfare of the United States. It seems to me that we can best do this by making life easier for everyone, by simplifying the Tax Code. What would you think of a system that, in general, takes a flat ten percent from every gross dollar of earnings, income and sales, without in any way affecting the net income dollars of Social Security recipients and the like? A system that hits hardest the highest consumers and is as fair, uniform, consistent, simple, effective and progressive as one can be? I have, and I know the answers."
