## C-SPAN -- LIVE ON-LOCATION IN BOSTON

### Five-Day Telecast to Examine Bay State Politics

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- The C-SPAN cable network spotlights Massachusetts politics, education, and media during a five-day cablecast -- on location in Boston, September 11-15.

Massachusetts is one of a handful of states selected for special election-year coverage on C-SPAN in its series "Campaign '86." Twenty-five hours of Massachusetts programming includes a look at the race for the state's Eighth Congressional district seat. Two candidate debates sponsored separately by Brandeis University and the League of Women Voters will be televised in their entirety. C-SPAN coverage of that race includes an exclusive interview with U.S. House Speaker Thomas P. "Tip" O'Neill, who is retiring from the 8th district seat.

Massachusetts politics is also the topic when Boston Mayor Raymond Flynn and state party chairmen Andrew Natsios (R) and U.S. Rep. Chester Atkins (D) participate in live viewer call-in programs.

Highlights include a special glimpse of Harvard University's 350th Anniversary celebration, featuring speeches by Supreme Court Justice William Brennan, Defense Secretary Caspar Weinberger, Great Britain's H.R.H. Prince Charles and Harvard University President Derek Bok. C-SPAN takes a "back-to-school" look at several Massachusetts colleges located in the Boston area academic community. Educators from Boston, Brandeis, Harvard and Tufts Universities discuss national issues and trends in higher education during C-SPAN interviews and call-ins.

During C-SPAN's five-day visit, cable viewers nationwide will have opportunity to see the old and new sights of Boston through "video vignettes" produced by Cablevision of Boston, a C-SPAN affiliate.

More than 30 cable systems serving nearly one-half million Boston-area cable subscribers carry the C-SPAN channel. Nationally, C-SPAN is seen in 25 million households, via 2,300 cable system affiliates.
