Simon LeVay neuroscientist from La Jolla, California who in '91 found a tiny segment of brain believed to govern sexual activity is smaller in homosexual men than heterosexual men. LeVay who is studying cadavers from homosexuals found the hypothalamus was only half as large in homo. men than heterosexuals.

Year's later UCLA researchers

24. found another section of brain this time an important structure connecting left & right sides known as anterior commissure is larger in homo. men than in women and heterosexual males.

A third study researchers at N.W. University and Boston Un. stated in Dec. '91 that if one identical twin was gay chances are better than even that other twin would be too. In contrast only one chance in 5 that non twin brothers of homosexuals were also gay.

Last March some researchers reported similar patterns of sex orientation among lesbian twins. Study after study shows information you can't shrug off.
