

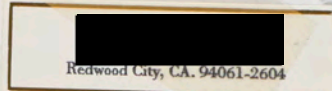

It is 3:43 p.m., Sunday afternoon, 2-26-95. I am right now watching this program that I just tuned in and I believe there are many children across the U.S. watching it right along with me.

First, I am offended, personally, for her/taking the Lords name in vain several times and by her reference to Christians as "Blue bellied nincompoops".

Second, I am disappointed in C-Span for their bad timing of this program, (Sunday afternoon), because there are children watching - people who have not matured enough to be able to sift the garbage from the truth.

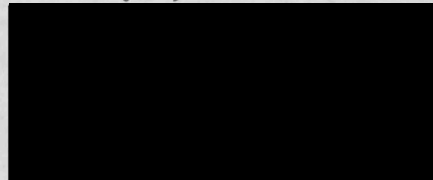


fundamentalists. However, I think the gap exists between intellectuals and those with a profound poverty of language, (demonstrated by herself in the above examples).
