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C-SPAN INTRODUCES A NEW SUNDAY SERIES

"C-SPAN's Week Ahead" -- An In Depth Discussion of National Issues

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- The C-SPAN cable network announces an addition to its Sunday evening line-up -- "C-SPAN's Week Ahead." The 90-minute live program, which premieres Sunday, April 6th at 8:00 PM ET, focuses on the national issues which will be covered by the public affairs network during the following week.

Each Sunday, the program's guests will spend the first 30 minutes giving background information and specifics of selected topics such as gun control, aid to the contras, and tax reform. A call-in hour follows giving viewers the opportunity to participate in the dialogue.

"C-SPAN viewers who watch Congress at work can be at a disadvantage because they haven't been privy to any behind-the-scenes political maneuvering," says program producer Eileen Quinn. "'C-SPAN's Week Ahead' will provide our audience with a greater insight into these inner workings of Washington," she adds.

C-SPAN was created by the cable industry in 1979 and now provides round-the-clock public affairs programming. Nearly 24 million U.S. homes can now watch C-SPAN programming via 2,000 affiliated cable systems.

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
