Re: Conduct of Interviews

Dear Mr. Lamb:

Now that the dust has settled on the Judge Clarence Thomas hearings and interviews, I wish to draw your attention to an episode that occurred in an interview program aired on C-Span at 8:00A.M. on Friday, October 11, 1991, at which time Juan Williams of the Washington Post was one of your guest panelists.

Consistently throughout this program, Mr. Williams consistently referred to Anita Hill, as "Miss Hill", and not as Professor Hill, (which is an appellation which she had earned); while always referring to Clarence Thomas, as "Judge", although when his activities at education and E.E.O.C. were being discussed, he was most surely not a judge. I later learned of Mr. Williams' bias toward Professor Hill, after reading some of his Post articles. I certainly would not challenge Mr. Williams' right to pursue his own agenda, while proclaiming his objectivity

What does bother me, Mr. Lamb, is that you did not see fit, during this program of considerable length, to call Mr. Williams' attention to the fact that most assuredly, Anita Hill, was entitled to be called "Professor", in the face of his obvious efforts to denigrate her. This approach of Mr. Williams became obvious to me, only minutes into the program.

Am I asking too much of a program host to be conscious and aware of such matters; and do you think it would have been appropriate for such a host to call this to the attention of a guest?

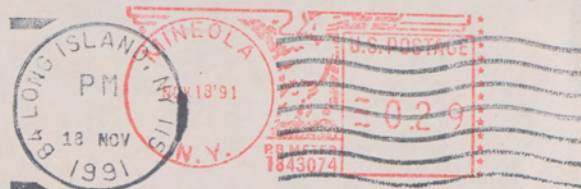
