DIGITAL CABLE RADIO TO OFFER C-SPAN AUDIO NETWORKS

Washington, DC, June 6, 1993 -- Digital Cable Radio has reached an agreement to offer the C-SPAN Audio Networks as part of their news and information programming package, it was announced today. This agreement distinguishes DCR as the only digital audio service that offers news and information in addition to other entertainment programming.

"We are pleased to be included in DCR's programming package," said Willie Vereen, C-SPAN National Accounts Manager. "C-SPAN's public affairs value will assist operators in launching this emerging service, and DCR subscribers will literally have a world of information available through the BBC World Service and Audio 1's international broadcasts."

The C-SPAN Audio Networks were created in 1989 to provide a global perspective on news and public affairs events. C-SPAN Audio 1 provides international news and information broadcasts in English, from Europe, the Pacific Rim and Cuba. C-SPAN Audio 2 carries the BBC World Service live, 24 hours a day.

Launched on satellite May 21, 1990, DCR was the first digital audio service to be commercially available to U.S. cable subscribers. Headquartered in Hatboro, PA, DCR is a programming service of Digital Cable Radio Associates, L.P., a partnership of between General Instrument Corporation's Jerrold Communications Division and several of the United States' top cable operators: Adelphia Cable Communications, Times Mirror Cable Television, and since its recent expansion in February, 1993, Time Warner Cable and subsidiaries of Sony Software Corporation and Warner Music Group.
