I am amused that the NOW crowd is saying that Mr. Clinton crime is only about sex, and they should just forgive him and let him get on with his life. Judge Starr, there are thousand of innocent men in prison though-out America, convicted of sex crimes on only the woman words. And no one is asking that they be forgiven.

I feel that it is so wrong as to how the Democratic members are going after you. 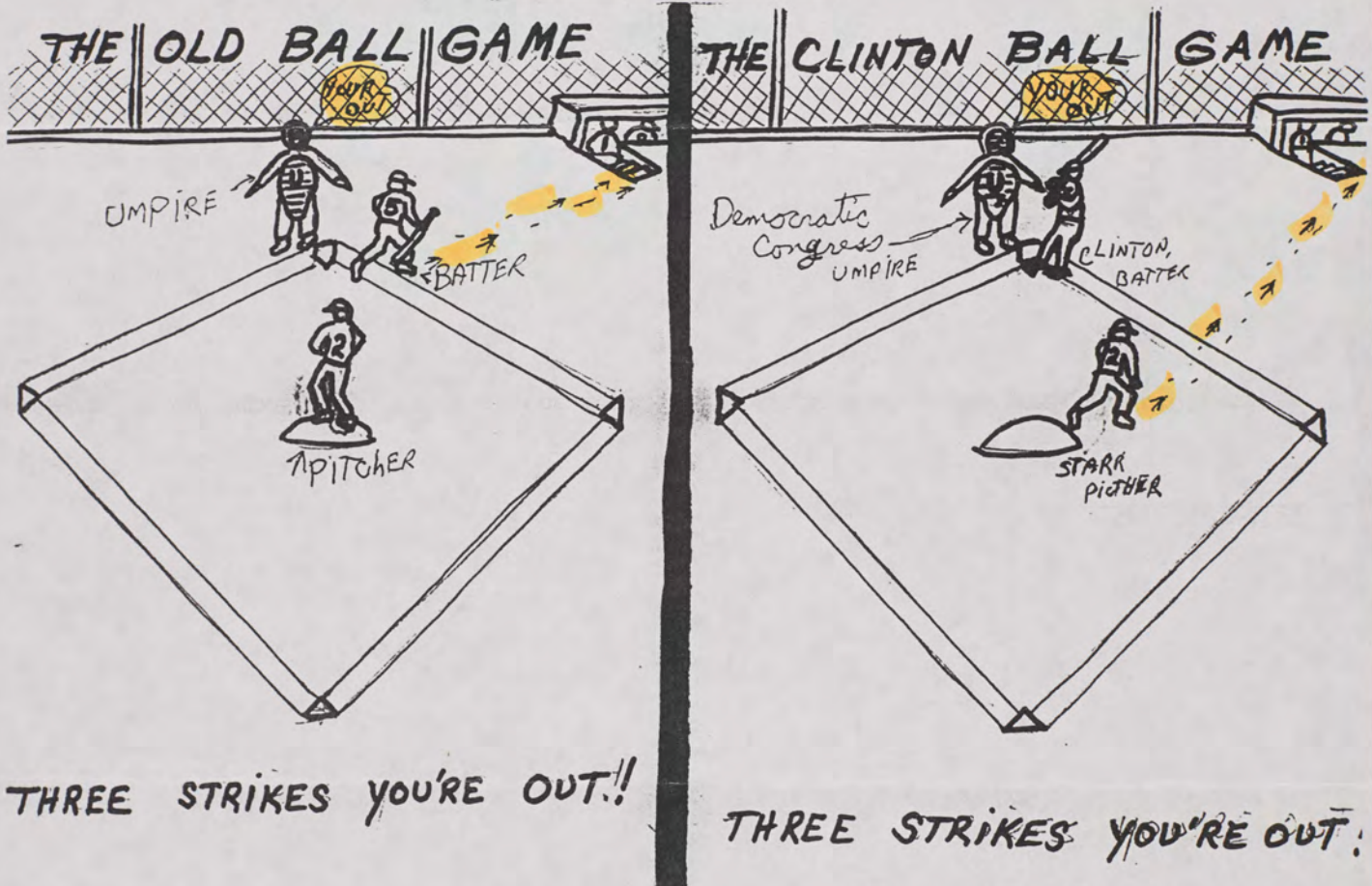
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Dear: Mr. Lamb;
