C-SPAN AIRS NEWSPAPER EDITOR'S MEETING LIVE

Washington, D.C., April 4 -- C-SPAN will air portions of the American Society of Newspaper Editors' annual convention live from Washington, D.C. on Friday, April 6, beginning at 9:00am ET.

Coverage will include panel discussions with journalists and citizens focusing on the changes in Europe, the drug war, and the environment, as well as speeches by President George Bush, CBS News Anchor Dan Rather, and author Tom Wolfe. A taped panel discussion on the issues of the 1960s will air on Sunday, April 8, at 4:00pm ET.
