Dear Mr. Lamb:

I would like to appeal the decision of 9 Apr 1994, 328/212-6, VA C# 25-101-099, SSN 359-42-7963 by the Department of Veterans Affairs, 536 S. Clark St., Chicago, IL 60605.

On the record of 9 Apr 1994, the VA has again changed my social security number. My social security number is 359-42-7963 and not the new number I have been given (319-30-8469). If I may humbly request because this has happened, now, and also in the past, that a review be done of all my social security records, my veterans records and my military records.

The records of the Social Security Administration indicate the amounts of money I earned since discharge from the U.S. Army in 1969 and average earnings for that 14 year period equal \$6,961.07. See enclosure. This, after receiving a penetrating gunshot wound to the head and brain tissue removed the size of a "lime." \$102,785.54 is the total amount of money I have earned in the 19 year period of my employment. This includes the 14 years since being wounded in Viet Nam. I do not want my records confused with anyone else. I would like to ask the Department of Veterans Affairs to justify this difference that I have pointed out before, but, remains unchanged. Also, the color of the paper that the decisions are written on cannot be photocopied.

I pray for a just and honorable consideration of this matter with due concern for all its ethical ramifications. My appeal for retro-active benefits will not be allowed to proceed to the Board of Veterans Appeals in Washington, D.C. in spite of this history of cheating.

I am simply asking not to be discriminated against or treated unfairly because I am disabled and have a significant loss incognitive ability.

A copy of this letter will be sent to Janet Reno, Attorney General. I will ask her to look at this situation in a merciful way towards resolution of my case and the backlog of other veterans and their claims. "Justice delayed is justice denied." The longer I am discriminated against as a disabled person, the longer out system of justice will remain on trial.

As a matter of fact, veterans role as research is not only unholy but also unconstitutional. And, now with the end of the Cold War, cannot be justified on the grounds of national security.

Veterans used as research is a fraud and informed consent is not the target of everyone's concern or whether it is considered properly.

To you this may not seem important, but, this is indicative of the systematic abuse veterans endure continuously. I am disabled and have been treated very badly and now, this content of my social security number.

I have also asked to be assigned a docket number in order to appear before the BVA (Board of Veterans Appeals) in Washington, D.C., but, because my case involves repayment of benefits lost thru trickery, I must continue to wait.

Also, along with Frank Pavone, President of Greater Chicago Viet-Now, I try to help other veterans, especially Viet Nam era vets, and the Directors Office, Hines VA Hospital, Hines, IL 60143, is harassing our membership while they are in the hospital.

The situation is becoming very difficult. Please, have mercy on me and help me.
