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And now here is another government employee, the new Congressman from New Mexico, spouting anti-government rhetoric. Yet, on your morning broadcast of 6/10/97, he admitted: (1) his wife is a government employee in New Mexico, and (2) his daughter has a Federal government job (in the military, I believe); (3) in his own situation, he said he had just received a big "pay-raise" as a Congressman instead of staying at what he had been doing.

If Bono and this fellow are Republicans, no wonder there are fewer and fewer Democrats!

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Sonny Bono tops poll of GOP Senate contenders

SAN FRANCISCO — Rep. Sonny Bono could be the Republicans' best hope to unseat incumbent Democratic Sen. Barbara Boxer, a new poll showed Friday. Although Bono, the singer who now represents the Palm Springs area in Congress, has not officially announced plans to run for the Senate in 1998, the poll found he is more popular than three Republicans who have entered the race.



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
