Lincoln

William Benjamin Gould - 24yo. - band of fugitive slaves
Wilmington, NC.
Centralized vs. freed slaves.
Fending against reward - Andrew Wells Salmon chose
Lincoln's walk to Telegraph Office
Save the Union versus freeing the slaves. Willie dies
30 lbs. lighter
Lincoln speaking low brow dialect to cabinet - Emancipation
Proclamation
after Constitution
Uncle - not slave

Andrew Jackson Dulls - Charles Dickinson 26yo. killed 27
was killed by A. J. who was wounded
A. J. in 103 dull Nicholas Biddle and the 2nd Bank
kept 37 pistols
Jackson left school at 13 in a log cabin - unlike Biddle
He thought banking did more harm than good
Daniel Webster on a Committee (Chair. of Finance Comm.) Q bank
A. J. vetoed bill to renew charter - Senate failed to override
32 - Jackson won in a landslide - Bank lost charter in 36

Lyndon Johnson March 2, 1965 - Rolling Thunder began
P 130 - no. 2 in JFK, soaked his nursery in cutting back
100 bills in his legislation plan. - Roll. T. - a secret
"no one could do better" he worked in Congress
Bank into depression - pulled covers over his head.
Passed 90 of 115 Great Society programs - "most productive Congress ever"
Jan 22, 1973 - dead
P 146 - Sounds like rational for Dray.

Theodore Roosevelt P 175
Open in Dakota Territory - Marquis de Mores await murder
Russia and Japan
R loved war -
May 1905 - Russia loses 34 warships to the Japanese
T R didn't trust the Russians - He brings 2 sides together
Nobel Prize

Richard Nixon China - 1st Pres. to visit
Taiwan - Sec. of State Rogers tried
and failed with Mao

Ronald Reagan Soviet Union
Story of Stanislav Petrov - Lt. Col. - a fax nuclear launch
Reagan exploited Russia's economic weakness 80-85 - Pentagon
complete elimination of nuclear weapons budget
Petrov today lives alone - 30 miles from Moscow - never
recognized by his govt. - is so poor he has no phone service

Franklin Roosevelt lend-lease

John F. Kennedy - Cuban - boy of pigs
Pepe San Roman - Allan Dulles
Operation Zapata Richard Russell - friend
(fighters jets arrived late)
Kennedy died in his bedroom
1986 - last rebel was released from Cuban prison and
flew to Miami - he was 62

League of Nations - Henry Cabot Lodge hated Wilson for
3 reasons ① The scholar ② The war too late ③ Adult
Speaking tour 26 cities in 27 days - 10 speeches a day
Solt Lake - changed clothes - sweating -
sleptly - fell down in seat
Doubts - headache
Reported "nervous breakdown" - went back to W. to
massive stroke - couldn't speak

Lost Senate vote - died Feb 3, 1924 - didn't want
Wanted 3rd term Lodge & funeral
Jan 8, 1918 - 14 points speech to joint session of Congress

Geo. W. Bush -
1st met him - reality was in sharp contrast
39¹ to the popular image

You say decision to end 91 Gulf war was a missile
Rock Star Robin killed -

His desk - FDR's and JFK's

Truman - "I like old Joe. He's a decent fellow"
Western sector would require 4,500 tons a day
Operation Vittles - land a plane every 5 minutes
(5 July 1948) a record - 1,450 tons delivered in 24 hrs
then every 3 hours on Aug 12, 4742 tons of cargo
More

Truman might half have to drop atomic bomb
Joint Chiefs oppose continuing — Clay gets his planes

Fog

Jan 20, 1949 — 700 planes overhead — Is that possible?
Stalin didn't want a combined British/French and
American section. Also didn't want the Marsh
rate of 1 a min. — 12,941 tons in 24 hours.

Speech in Boston Oct 27, 1948 — Blames Republican for
spread of communism

Andrew Johnson

wanted to skip his evening
gulped down 3 whiskies at his evening.

John W. Booth's note in A.J.'s box PIII

Slaves withheld telegram from A.J. warning possible
New Orleans riots

Office of Alien Act — couldn't fire cabinet unless House agrees
Grant appointed to Dept of War interior — Then A.J.
appointed Gen. Thomas — Stanton holes up in office
before to leave

Impeachment 35 to 15 one short (7 moderate Rep.)
A.J. refused to hand out presidency (ceremoniously) to
Grant because of his betray/betrayal.

Speech to Senate Dec 12, 1867

Grover Cleveland

George Pullman — idyll community — 12,500 residents
wouldn't reduce the rent

Cleveland — Sheriff / Mayor / Governor

84 nominees — illegitimate child — substitutes for Civil War
Reluctant Pres.

he pushed Congress toward federal arbitration process
defeated by Ben. Harrison

return'd 93' — financial state troubling

panic of 93'

Pullman shut down company / Eugene Deb
100,000 nationwide strike

more

Cleveland -

He hated Pullman

July 1, 1894 - dam breaks - riots of 2 to 3000 people
Cleveland authorized federal troops even if Gov. didn't ask
for them - came for Cleveland to a preservation of order.
6000 workers destroyed 340,000 barrels of railroad prop.
4 rioters killed / 160 arrested
before it was over 16,000 troops nationwide / 40 men killed
Cleveland felt he had betrayed the workers - he instituted
annual Labor Day

Jefferson

1807 - British ship fires on American ships off coast
kills 3 wounds 18 (4 Brit. dead on board)
People thought US was headed to war - Jeff hated British
During his term he invited First British Minister to Anthony Merry
to W. H. for a state dinner - greeted him in slippers and robe
But we had no force - British had 500 ships
He ordered all British ships to leave
T. J. never served in military
Russia and France wouldn't help w. British
He proposed an embargo - end all trade with England
Closing seaports put 30,000 out of work
Embargo was staggering on economy - Exports declined 80%
56,000 sailors and 100,000 men nationwide out of work
One of his last acts - repeal of embargo in 1808
Madison declared war in 1812
credited T. J. with embargo buying time to build military
Annual Address to Congress Nov 8, 1808 p 295

Grant - schooner Grapeshot sails for Jamaica -
Hijacked to Cuba - two Americans escape to Spanish -
they plot to deathly -

Grant furious -
Ham Fish (Sec State) didn't want US to support rebels
would lead to war
Fish tried to negotiate with Spanish in Madrid -
situation in Cuba worsened

more

Grant - wanted to recognize rebels - Folsom holds off
Folsom concluded about John Rankin / See War
Rankin dying - Grant chose not to intervene in Cuba
11 days later Rankin died
Grant sends message to Congress asking them not to
vote for rebels. - debate was tumultuous
on June 16 House 100 to 20 to reject the resolution

Geo. WASH. - Whiskey Tax

Penn. French - 1853 - Geo. W. sent by Royal Governor to investigate French - killed 10 - Young WASH. Start French and Indian War. - He lost a $\frac{1}{2}$ of his men - fought for 5 more yrs. - he retired @ 26 wasn't very good
Whiskey tax - no one wanted to collect it.

G.W. had a healthy disdain for frontier settlers
eye gouging

Hamilton behind whiskey tax - tax rate in west 25%
tax passed in 1791 G.W. owned tens of thousands
of acres on the frontier

1794 - Hamilton sent US Marshall to serve warrant
in western PA.

1792 - 60 yrs removed a tumor - not sure about 2nd term
Wash opposed parties - in 1793 Jeff left cabinet
thought G.W. was supporting Hamilton
put down unrest in west. PA writes federal army
G.W. requested 12,000 troops - violence had spread
to 4 more states

He chose to lead troops G.W. 62 - wrenched his back
After two weeks he returned to Capitol - got
never successfully collected whiskey tax on the
frontier - Jeff. repealed it.
