HOWEVER the U.S. Navy's performance and importance was almost IGNORED. except for a few fragmentary references.

~~I don't~~ ^{be.} there does not appear any detailed ^{testimonies} descriptions such as you had for the Army and I'm well aware of the ^{total} numerical differences.

Permit me to suggest that your additional coverage (and you should do it) should include the story of the U.S.S. Corry (Destroyer) 463. She along with other naval vessels were providing close-in gun support just as the landing craft were racing for the beach at Utah. The Corry was sunk by shore batteries when it was not screened by smoke as were most of the fleet. 13 men were killed and

Many others injured, 234 men
were rescued by destroyers Fitch and Hobson.
Cornelius Ryan's "THE LONGEST
DAY" gives a dramatic account of the
action of the Corry that day.

An association of the Corry is
headed by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] is the remaining senior
officer.

The Utah Beach story would
not be complete without the presentation
of those occupying the front row
seats to the most dramatic battle
in our nation's history

The principal players and
the remains of the Corry are
available.
