"BOOKNOTES:" OCTOBER SCHEDULE

Washington, D.C., September 29, 1993 -- Every Sunday at 8:00 and 11:00 pm ET, C-SPAN brings cable viewers nationwide a one-hour interview with the author of a recent book on public affairs. In addition to the substance of his writings, "Booknotes" looks at life and interests of the author.

**Sunday, October 3** -- Peter Skerry discusses *Mexican-Americans: The Ambivalent Minority*, a comprehensive account of the lives of Mexican Americans, their impact on our society, and their prospects for assimilation. Mr. Skerry is a political science professor at UCLA and director of Washington Programs for the Center for American Politics and Public Policy.

**Sunday, October 10** -- C-SPAN interviews Alan Brinkley, author of *The Unfinished Nation: A Concise History of the American People*, a narrative of the American past, new knowledge and diverse perspectives that have changed the understanding of our history. Mr. Brinkley is a professor of history at Columbia University, his previous book *Voices of Protest* was the winner of the American Book Award in History in 1983.

"Booknotes" launched on April 2, 1989. Since then, more than 200 authors have appeared, including administration officials, Supreme Court justices, U.S. senators and representatives, columnists, librarians of Congress, historians, biographers, and others.
