-- C-SPAN'S "STATES OF THE NATION '85" TRAVELS TO RALEIGH, NC --

WASHINGTON, D.C.-- C-SPAN's "States of the Nation '85" tour swings south to Raleigh, North Carolina for a closer look at its state leaders and politics.

October 23-25, C-SPAN stops in North Carolina to preview the 1986 race for the U.S. Senate seat being vacated by Republican John East and for an overview of state politics, economics, and social programs. C-SPAN's Raleigh visit is being hosted by Cablevision of Raleigh/Durham, owned by American Telecommunications Corp.

C-SPAN's programming features viewer call-in shows originating live via satellite from Raleigh; C-SPAN hosts will moderate from the network's Washington, D.C. studios. Guests include Former Gov. James Hunt (D), Republican senatorial candidates U.S. Rep. James Broyhill and Ambassador David Funderburk and the State Democratic and National Congressional Club chairmen. An interview with Lt. Gov. Bob Jordan is also scheduled.

In addition to talking politics, C-SPAN focuses on North Carolina's economy and educational system. Representatives from the tobbacco industry, the textile industry, and the state's "Research Triangle" lend their expertise on current economic conditions and trends. The presidents of the University of N.C. at Chapel Hill and a unique public high school for gifted students in math and science discuss education policy on viewer call-ins.

Between programs, cable viewers will see glimpses of Raleigh and the North Carolina state fair in brief video interludes.
