**Conversation 3853 with J. Edgar Hoover,
Director of the FBI**

Date: 6/23/64 Time: 5:25 PM

President Johnson calls FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover for an update on the FBI's search in Mississippi for Michael Schwerner, Andrew Goodman and James Chaney, three civil rights workers who have been missing in the state for two days. Hoover provides more information on the FBI's discovery of the car the three men had been riding in, found burning along the highway near the towns of Philadelphia and Meridian, Mississippi. Schwerner and Goodman's parents are in Washington seeking answers from their Congressmen and Johnson administration officials. Johnson is deliberating about whether or not to see the parents in person.

OUT CUE: LBJ: "Any idea when I'll get word on that?" Hoover: "We'll probably get word sometime this evening."

**Conversation 3882 with Mrs. Nathan Schwerner,
Mother of Michael Schwerner**

LBJ 3882: 1:05

Date: 6/23/64 Time: 8:35 PM

President Johnson calls a sobbing Anne Schwerner to inform her that her son's body was not found in the car found burning that day along Mississippi Highway 21.

OUT CUE: LBJ: "Thank you, ma'am."

**Conversation 4153 with Jacqueline Kennedy,
Widow of President John F. Kennedy**

LBJ 4153: 1:25

Date: 7/4/64 Time: 7:15 PM

From his ranch near Johnson City, Texas, President Johnson calls Hyannis Port, Massachusetts. In this clip, he is chatting with former First Lady Jacqueline Kennedy. They discuss President Johnson's younger daughter, 17-year-old Luci Baines Johnson, and her wish to go out without a Secret Service Agent.

OUT CUE: LBJ: "I long to see you" Jackie: "We'll see you soon. Bye."

**Conversation 4601 with Robert McNamara,
Secretary of Defense**

LBJ 4601: 1:57

Date: 8/1/64 Time: 9:00 AM

Secretary McNamara speaks with the president about how his decision to exclude Attorney General Robert Kennedy from vice presidential consideration is shaking out in the newspapers, mentioning columnists Mary McGrory and Joseph Kraft. The two discuss Mr. Kennedy's plans, including a possible run for Senate in New York or a year of travel abroad.

OUT CUE: McNamara: "...that's the only bad one I've seen."

Conversation 5895 with Lady Bird Johnson

LBJ 5895: 3:09

Date: 10/15/64 Time: 9:12 AM

After learning that presidential aide Walter Jenkins was arrested the week before after a sexual tryst with a man at the downtown Washington YMCA, First Lady Lady Bird Johnson Early the next morning calls the president to discuss steps she'd like to take to show support for Mr. Jenkins: offer Mr. Jenkins a job at their Texas television station KTBC and issue a public statement. President Johnson strongly cautions against her doing either, and the two debate the issue. Mr. Johnson urges Mrs. Johnson to talk with advisers Abe Fortas and Clark Clifford before taking any action.

OUT CUE: LBJ: "...you just can't do that to the Presidency, honey."
