Dear Brian:

Yesterday I watched your show "D-Day: 50 years later". It was great. I found it to be very, very emotional. I'm not ashamed to say that I had tears in my eyes through most of the show. The pictures of the cemeteries was heart rending.

Brian, on June 6, 1944

On our tank deck we had 18, 32 ton Army tanks. On top deck we had ambulances, jeeps and other small vehicles.

We were supposed to land on Omaha beach in the early morning but because of congestion on the beach and sunken smaller landing craft we did not land until close to 12 PM.

I remember the water being very rough and the day overcast from the clouds and the smoke from all the gunfire.

After the war Brian,



everything went back to being normal.

I went to college, got a job,  
got married and had two children.

It's amazing Brian that  
after 50 years that day is still so vivid  
in my mind.

I'm sitting here writing  
this letter to you and I can still picture  
the German planes strafing the beaches  
and our war ships bombing the German  
defenses.

Well Brian, that's all  
for now. I'm anxiously awaiting your  
next show which will be on at 11 PM today.

I tried to call you on  
Sat but I couldn't get through. Will  
try again today.

Keep up the good work.
