Washington DC, June 6, 1993 -- The C-SPAN School Bus, a bright yellow 45-foot customized motor coach, will hit the road this September on a nation wide tour to promote the use of C-SPAN as a valuable educational tool.

"This bus is a visual connection with the local community about our programming service and the cable industry that brings it to them."

The bus will house a multimedia educational experience for teachers, students and cable operators. Video decks will showcase the various aspects of C-SPAN's programming, computer stations will show teachers ways of accessing C-SPAN program information, and a compact production facility will generate on-air coverage as well as student programming activities during stops.
