C-SPAN NAMES NEW PRODUCERS FOR INTERNATIONAL AND COURTS COVERAGE

Connie Doebele and Lew Ketcham Promoted to Programming Posts

WASHINGTON, D.C., October 17 -- C-SPAN has named Connie Doebele its Senior Producer of International Programming, a newly created position at the 10-year-old network.

Lew Ketcham has been promoted to Courts Producer, replacing Ms. Doebele in that post.

Ms. Doebele will supervise C-SPAN's coverage of Queen Elizabeth II's speech to the opening of Parliament and the historic coverage of the first televised British House of Commons debates, starting November 21. She will also plan future coverage of other European governments.

Ms. Doebele has been with C-SPAN for over five years in a variety of assignments, including in-house producer, unit manager, and Special Events producer. Since 1985, she has been the network's Court Producer.

Originally from Hanover, Kansas, Ms. Doebele was a news anchor and new director at radio stations in Kansas before moving the Washington, D.C. in 1980. Prior to her work at C-SPAN, she served as press secretary for U.S. Rep. Dan Glickman (D-KS).

In his new role, Mr. Ketcham will supervise the network's coverage of the U.S. Supreme Court and other federal courts. He will also produce the weekly series, "America and the Courts," which airs weekly at 7 p.m. ET Saturdays.

Mr. Ketcham has been with C-SPAN for more than three years as an in-house producer. Prior to coming to C-SPAN, he was an executive producer with WAVY-TV in Norfolk, Virginia.

He is a native of Leavenworth, Kansas.

C-SPAN, the Cable-Satellite Public Affairs Network, is available in 46.6 million cable households nationwide and around the world via satellite. The network is privately funded and is a public service of the cable television industry.

Connie Doebele has been with C-SPAN for over 5 years in a variety of capacities including In-House Producer, Unit Manager, Special Events Producer, and now Senior Producer. She currently is in charge of International Programming and will lead C-SPAN crews on trips to London and Paris in the next year. Since 1985, she has covered the Supreme Court for C-SPAN, including the concept and development of C-SPAN's weekly series, "America & the Courts." In addition, she acts as a moderator for C-SPAN call-in programs. Prior to her work at C-SPAN, Connie served three years as press secretary for Congressman Dan Glickman (D-Kansas). Originally from Hanover, Kansas, Connie was a news anchor and news director at radio stations in Kansas before moving to Washington in 1980.

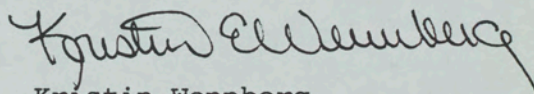

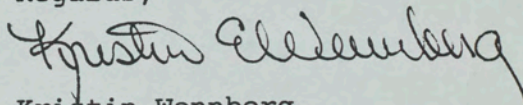
