Dear Mr. Scully,

IN 1968 I was [redacted] years old, a  
Veteran of the U.S. Navy, 1954-58, serving  
2 years at Sea, 8 Mo's off Vietnam.  
I was a photographer and involved in  
Intelligence work over Indochina '58, '59.  
Didn't know a Vietnam War was on the  
way then.

In 1968 I [redacted]  
[redacted] of the "Vietnam Veterans Against  
the War", I was a registered republican -  
However, a group of US Viet-Vets Flew  
off to New Hampshire to work for  
Presidential Candidate then, U.S. Sen.  
Eugene J. McCarthy, Dem, Minn. I  
became the Campaign Staff photographer.

McCorty nearly won the Democratic  
Primary in N.H., we "the children's cause",  
"Clean for Gene" helped and we ~~lost~~ <sup>won</sup>  
the Wisconsin primary then in Indiana  
Bobby Kennedy entered the race. (Johnson  
Dropped out)

In 1967 in Washington, D.C. with  
300 members of "Clergy + Laity concerned  
about Vietnam" Bobby Kennedy had  
accepted to speak to us on Vietnam.  
He did NOT show up - He sent Jeff  
Greenfield (now of ABC-TV news). We  
told Jeff that we would not support  
Bobby if he ran for President in 1968!

I met Bobby + Dr. Martin Luther King Jr  
& photographed them that year and I photographed  
the Washington, D.C. "King Riots" As a white  
man I had no trouble in doing that.
