Dear Mr. Clinton our honorable President:

Greetings! It is my objective to write in concern to the Bosnia situation.

I write with the plan for peace and the direct goal of the United States to support other world Allies in the U.N. or Nato to maintain peace in the region.

I find the Vance-Owen plan a script for disaster and can understand why the Serbs do not want to accept it. The land proportions favor the Bosnians & Croatian Muslims. I believe it would be our best interest to propose an evenly divided pie of land settlement. This will at least prove to the world we in the U.S. are not favoring a particular side in this civil war conflict. It is of course our objective to not follow Viet-Nam policies even though I believe these 2 conflicts are entirely different and reflect no Communist, Komore Rouge, or similar S. East Asian Tugh Government. interactions.

I do believe we should adopt a peace objective role .. and not a military opposition in favor of Bosnians or Croats, or Serbians. Thus the even distribution of territory will at least initiate a peace until eventually the 3 sides can come to agree they should be one country living side by side and working toward supporting life for one another in their country and the world.

I do not favor Air-strikes due to the inaccurate striking capability. Surgical strikes work in areas where civilians are not at risk. Yet in Iraq and Lib sites is/ are proof that terrorism now uses civilian populations to deter big bomb missile or air-strikes, thus injuring civilians.

If we do go in I think we need a coalition similar to the Iraqi mission. We need to block off the Strait of Otranto off the coast of Italy and Albania. We should bring in an air-craft carriers to establish bases of communication.

I then believe we need the cooperation of Italy, Austria, Albania, Hungary, Romania, Bulgaria, and Greece in order to distribute 20,000 ground troops in each of these allied countries. This support will surround the country of Yugoslavia and highly suggest to Karadzic & Milosovich to seek peace with Bosnia & Croatia.

I think it important for Boris Yeltsin to support this coalition in order to establish a direction in his own country ..

to stop the killing in ~~Algeria~~ Azerbaijan and Georgia, Armenia.

Once the Bosnia situation is resolved more of a resolve can be anticipated in Russia for the go ahead for Boris Yeltsin's reform and the establishment of Democracy.

We should be able to operate out of Cairo and have the support of Israel + Syria.

I disagree with Al Gore our honorable Vice President in the lifting of arms embargo to help arm the Bosnians and Croatia. This is a similar policy the U.S. followed with Iraq when they bought arms and it back-fired on us. We should not put guns & weapons in the hands of the criminals because an escalation of war crimes will be established.

Our greatest weapon ^{army} to save lives is the force of numbers to show ^(surround) around Yugoslavia. If of course the atrocities continue and the Serbs refuse to accept the equal pie territory plan, the objective is to move our forces of the entire circle around Yugoslavia closer inward.. with the intent to defend ourselves yet persuade the Serbs, Croats, & Bosnians to give it up. This will eventually work since soon a later conflict areas will be eliminated until allied troops meet allied troops and the conflict ended. I think we can accomplish this in 6-7 months or the same time frame as we involuntarily in Somalia.

I figure one month per country that surrounds Yugoslavia.

I do not think we should exclude an air-power... but to use them if our troops are fired upon by using 50 caliber machine gun fire and other small arm smart projectiles to knock out resistance.

We need these ground troops I have suggested to surround Yugoslavia to give support to our British comrades who support the U.N. humanitarian ground mission already now there in the region. This will convince that if the Serbs attack our U.N. troops inside Yugoslavia then they will be approached from their back-side and be persuaded to surrender their initiative.

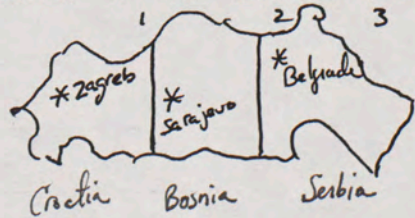
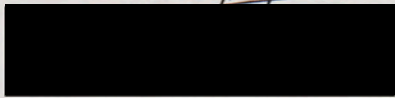

Once this is accomplished we should have no problem to pull our troops out through an easy transitional deployment in which we come out the same way we came in.

It is my hope Secretary Christopher will negotiate this plan I call it the Teirao Initiative which divides territories equally to establish peace first they negotiate. YUGO-SLAVIA is
