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To whom it may concern:

I just watched a show 9:00 Eastern Standard Time on C-SPAN, in which reporters, where inviting call - in's to respond to their reaction on media reporting. This is Friday, March 25, 1994. You were gracious enough to give your address at the end of the show.

If she were to leave the welfare rolls right now and go to work at McDonalds. She would have no MEDICAL benefits. What's her choice. Go to school. She is an A student. Try your best to entire the job market, with a job which will offer imediate medical benefits. Her childrens medical problems can not be put on a 3 month or 6 month waiting period that a lot of employers require. FACT, I have another daughter, she has some college, attends school at night, has one son. Works every day. Earns just enough money to take care of herself and her son's personal needs. Can not afford an apartment or a home of her own. She would very much like to move away from my home, but with the current job MARKET, WHAT can she do? She is constantly juggling her son and Job to find affordable child care with someone she can trust? I subsidize her when, I am working. I don't mind, but wouldn't it be good if some of that 26% went to assist her with affordable housing?

To summarize, stop the sensationilizing and stick to reporting on facts and information, which effects the lives of the public now and in the not to far future. Congress, needs to address the domestic issues or go home and try to find jobs in this MARKET. I dare they take valuable time to look into an issue hich happened so long ago, even the Clinton's have forgotten some of the details. Why focus on Whitewater? What's the purpose? How many folks are walking around who stole millions of dollars during the REAGON policy of S&L and banking deregulation? It's obvious the Clintons are not millionairs.
