A rare live telecast with Supreme Court Chief Justice Warren Burger, who heads up the commission planning a variety of state and local events to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the U.S. Constitution. Mr. Burger will conduct a press conference and then move to a Congressional hearing room to meet with nationally-known figures who serve on the panel.

This week, C-SPAN's series on the mid-term elections talks with Illinois Congressman Dick Durbin, who is organizing a nationwide tour of college campuses for the Democratic Party (9:30 pm ET) and then takes viewers to the gala fundraising dinners of the Republican National Committee (10:30 pm ET) with President Reagan and the Democratic National Committee (11:30 pm ET) with Sen. Ted Kennedy.
