
Finally on July 20, 1991 the Associated Press released the following information in an article in the New York Times - Disease Kills 600 in Nigeria - Lagos, Nigeria July 20 (AP). An unidentified disease that is fatal in six days has killed about 600 people in southeastern Nigeria and prompted thousands of others to flee, doctors and community leaders say. The disease is "characterized by fever, general body pain, jaundice, vomiting of blood, restlessness, inability to pass urine and coma followed by death," Dr. Samuel Idiagbe told reporters on Friday. Some towns in Bendel state, including Mbiri, Igboodo, and Emuhu are recording about six deaths a day from the disease said Dr. Idiagbe medical director of Anoma Hospital in Agbor - Do you at C-Span have any information (over)

Is this disease something new and is it viewed as a threat to kill millions of Nigerians and later millions of Americans? Please check into this for me and send me whatever information you have on this disease.
