Dear Chairman Rostenkowski:

I don't know if you are guilty of the things the Justice Department alleges that you are guilty of or not. But I do know that I have had enough of the endless hypocrisy and deception of certain Washington politicians and the news media.

For months now, we have been subjected to the spectacle of Senators Robert J. Dole, Alfonse D'Amato and Phil Gramm and Representatives Newt Gingrich and Jim Leach, and the news media, demanding full investigations of President and Mrs. Clinton's involvement in the Whitewater land deal. And now that this case appears to be weak and the American people are disgusted with it and want Congress to deal with the real problems of out-of-control health care costs and rampaging crime, we suddenly have another Republican-sponsored scandal — to wit, the belated, bizarre, inconsistent but highly convenient allegations of Paula Jones, who reminds me for all the world of one of those women who insists she has been kidnapped by Space Aliens every year on her birthday. And of course Dole and his fearless defenders of American morality want you prosecuted to the full extent of the law and packed off to jail so they can sabotage President Clinton's health care program with their endless amendments, revisions, objections and delays.

BUT in the meantime, this same Robert J. Dole
