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To whom it may concern, please:

I was unable to call in - to make comment and/or to express opinion yesterday evening between 6:00 and 6:30 to the younger fellow who was discussing the present day situation in Russia. But I think he was all too bland in his assessment of that situation.

As he was going off the air he rather glibly mentioned that there are groups in that country and in that area of the world who are favoring more democratic systems for their way of living. But, as he stated, there doesn't seem to be any strong moving in that direction.

Maybe he doesn't know that Nikita Khrushchev son Alexis, I think his name is, and his wife catapulted themselves out of there about a year and a half ago, leaving his arsenal of weaponry and related devices loaded and ready to be put into use at a moments notice. (In coming over here to live he of course makes the claim that he wishes to now do his part to make the transition to a more democratic system of government ^{over there} - and accompanying lifestyle - "as painless as possible." Well! Guess who - would be hurt by a conversion to

grateful conditions. What a classic remark That was! And, of course, don't expect to see him involved in anything so self ^{defeating} ~~defeating~~ as that!

And I would cite also a remark made by a gentleman (in whose audience I had been) that the Jews are leaving Russia as fast as they can and in any way that they can get out. (This man had been in Russia a few months ago. And spoke, then, on the basis of his observations, what he heard, etc.)

Another comment that should have been made to your speaker (on whatever his title and/or role) would have been in reference to Mr. Yeltsin's declaration - two weeks ago today - that he knew that he would ^{be} stepping outside (of) the Constitution to call for an election (of Parliament members) this fall. "But I'm going to do it anyway!" (There is much more substance & and "rigging" behind that subject than we are going to go into here, of course.)

It surely sounds like the same old blood and knuckles system that Karl Marx "introduced" the Russians to - in 1917 + 1918. The system that he and Joe Stalin used to "liquidate 25 to 35 million Russians and Baltics people. (They were nice guys, though!)

It looks to me like Yeltsin and Co. are running pretty scared, when they start using a bull whip to run their "new democracy". For a people who aren't supposed to be very concerned about their freedom from tyrannical rule to get Yeltsin and his pals that frightened - what would happen if those people did get interested in having their oppressors run out of their country?! Whew! That would be something!
