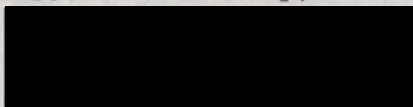
I was shocked to hear one woman reporter laugh and call the Clinton business "a good story."

Journalism has indeed become a shallow paparazzi image of what we once had. See the enclosed cartoon.

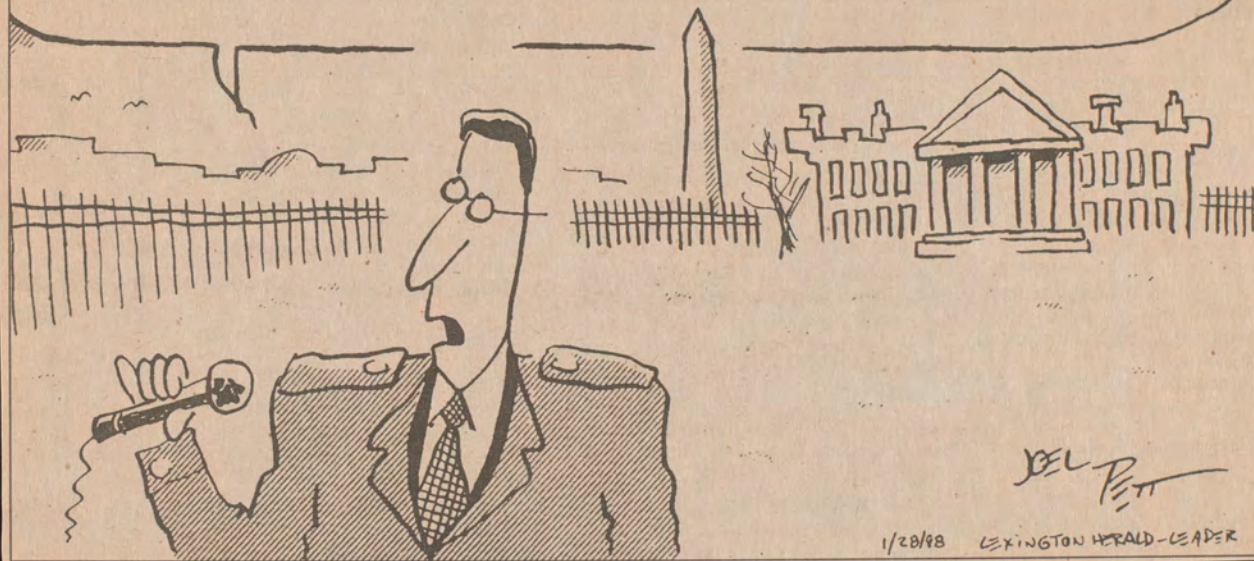
Once again, thanks for C-Span, and I only wish I could get C-Span 2.

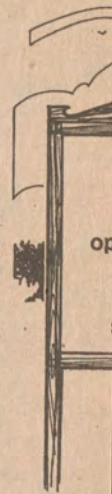
