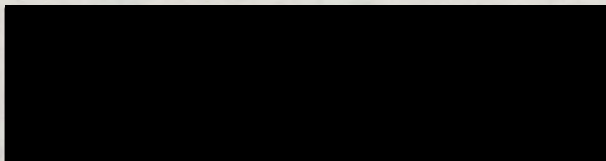
I wonder if the United States is more fortunate that its citizens are blessed with programming such as C-Span or if C-Span and media like it are more fortunate to live in a country where they can do so.

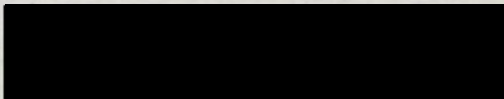
