Guru Vows to Stay in India

NEW DELHI—Guru Bhagwan Shree Rajneesh, ordered out of the United States last week, is staying at a high-security Himalayan resort to recover from his "harrowing experiences," news reports Tuesday quoted his disciples as saying.

The United News of India said the Indian guru and a few disciples living in the sprawling Span resort complex near Manali, 240 miles north of New Delhi, and plan to remain there for three months. The guru looks for a permanent home in India.

He has not talked to representatives in Manali, but the news reports his disciples as saying he wants to "recover from the experiences" of spending time in jail. The 53-year-old guru returned to India Sunday

after pleading guilty to one count of lying to the U.S. Immigration Service and one count of conspiring to arrange sham marriages, aimed at enabling foreign disciples to remain in the United States.

He was ordered to leave the United States after his guilty plea last week.

The news agency said authorities in Manali were concerned that Rajneesh's presence might lead to drug trafficking and hippie communes.

Rajneesh, self-styled guru of the rich, left India four years ago and set up a commune in Oregon.

Rajneesh told reporters Sunday that America is a "hypocrisy" and his American jailers were "subhuman." He said he was "finished with the whole world," would not set up any more communes, and would never leave India again because it is a place where people treat him with "love and respect."
