MEMORANDUM

TO: All Employees
FROM: Elena Fernandez, President
DATE: February 25, 1992
RE: The 1992 Presidential Election

We should be reminded that this network is merely monitoring the 1992 Presidential election process. We are not seeking to set rules, establish norms, or pass judgments. We will stick to the issues be conscientious in our reporting, focus our efforts on making our viewers politically knowledgeable and produce the most competent coverage, so that viewers will say that this network has done a credible and fair job of covering the presidential campaign. In achieving these aims this network will concentrate on reporter behavior, professionalism, and network neutrality.

Our goal is to present relevant and pertinent facts. We will not sensationalize our coverage by attempting to slander candidates with idle gossip. We will not concentrate unduly on the candidates' personal lives. Instead we will focus on what the candidates' plans are for health care, unemployment, the economy, welfare reforms, etc.

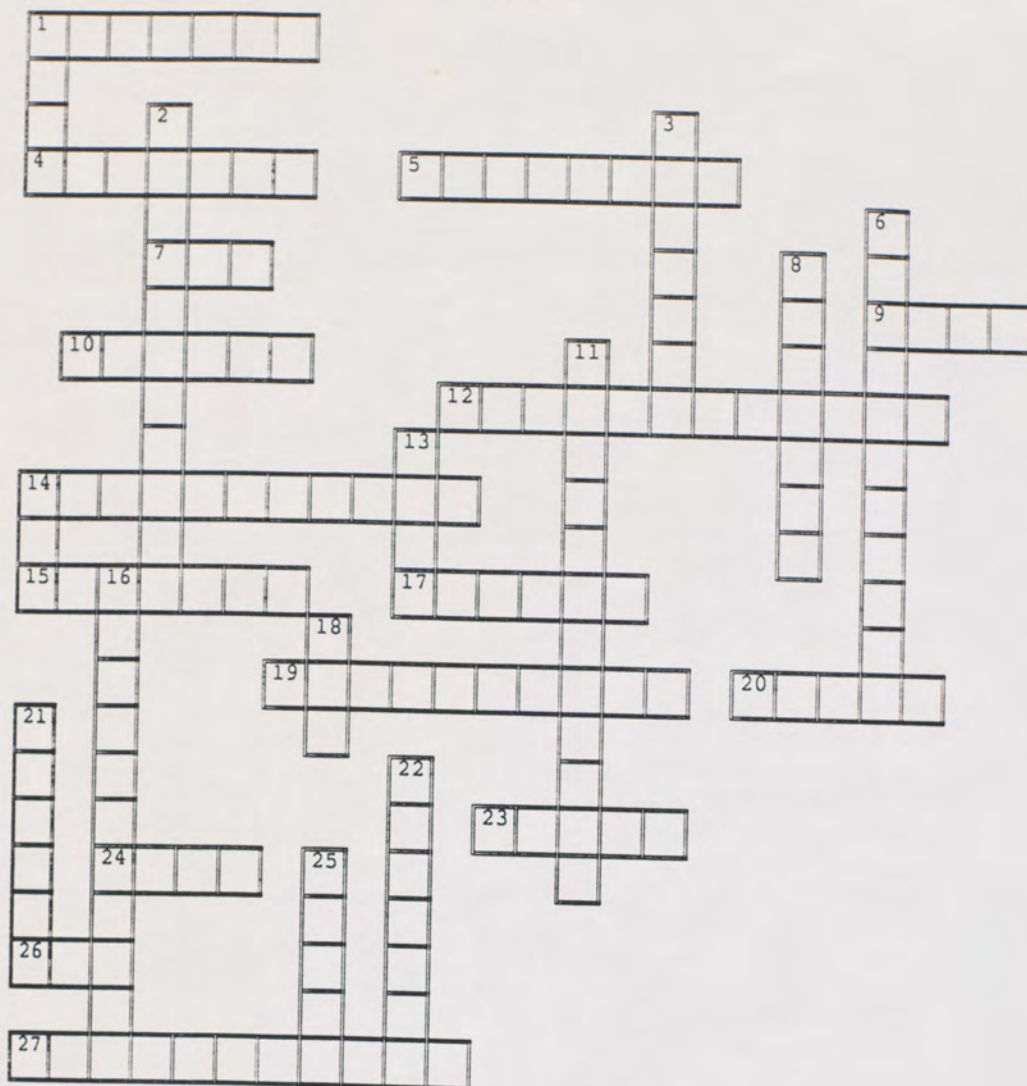

C-SPAN AND THE UNITED NEGRO COLLEGE FUND AWARD SCHOLARSHIP
AND SUMMER INTERNSHIP TO CALMETTA Y. COLEMAN

Washington, D.C., July 15, 1991 -- C-SPAN, the Washington, D.C. based Cable Satellite Public Affairs Network and the United Negro College Fund (UNCF) have awarded a tuition scholarship and internship to Calmetta Y. Coleman, a minority student from Dillard University in Louisiana.

Calmetta is originally from Mound Bayou, Mississippi. Having completed her sophomore year as a Mass Communications major with a minor in Business Management, her G.P.A. is a perfect 4.0. This exceptional student has also been awarded an Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. Scholarship, a Southeastern Association for Education Opportunity Personnel Program Scholarship, and a Presidential Award for Academic Achievement. Calmetta attributes her academic success to the inspiration provided by her grandmother, Ereda Coleman.

The scholarship/internship program is designed to expand educational and training opportunities for a selected student attending a UNCF institution. The eight-week long internship, scheduled to begin June 19th will provide Calmetta with intensive exposure to the way C-SPAN is programmed. The internship responsibilities will include researching issues, logging tapes, gathering information on possible guests and issues, clipping news articles, and attending editorial meetings.

The C-SPAN/UNCF Scholarship/Intern award was open to full-time students of UNCF's 41 private, historically black member colleges and universities. The program awarded \$1,500.00 toward tuition and a summer-long internship in the Programming department at C-SPAN. The student will be housed at Howard University in Washington, D.C. and will also receive a weekly stipend.

Scholarship candidates were required to submit a resume and essay explaining their choice of a career in communications or political science. UNCF then selected eight finalists who were later reviewed by C-SPAN.

C-SPAN is currently available in 54 million households nationwide and worldwide via satellite. C-SPAN is privately funded to serve the public by America's cable television companies.
