C-SPAN INTRODUCES "CAMPAIGN '86"

Weekly Series to Focus on the 1986 Senate and Gubernatorial Races

WASHINGTON, D.C. --- Next week, C-SPAN cable network introduces a special weekly series called "Campaign '86." The series is intended to provide a birds-eye view of the 1986 elections for the network's 23 million subscribers.

The series debuts on February 14, and focuses on the '86 Senate and Gubernatorial races around the country. Plans call for the series to air every Friday at 10:30 PM ET with a repeat on Sunday at 5:00 PM ET. The programs are scheduled to last one hour, but occasionally the "Campaign '86" time slot will be lengthened to present related programs. This special '86 election series includes candidate speeches, political rallies, in-depth interviews with political experts, and a look at campaign advertisements. Throughout the year, this series will highlight races in different states, including: Florida, Oklahoma, Wisconsin, California, Illinois, Missouri, Colorado, South Dakota, Arkansas,

Texas, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont, Louisiana and South Carolina. On occasion, C-SPAN affiliates in these areas will participate in "Campaign '86" by covering events to be aired on the network.

In explaining the concept for "Campaign '86", C-SPAN political editor and series producer Carl Rutan says, "The political stakes in 1986 are quite high. The Democrats are trying to regain a majority in the Senate while the Republicans are hoping to maintain control of the Senate and pick up a few governorships as well." Rutan adds, "Both parties hope to use the '86 elections to position themselves for 1988." "Campaign '86" will examine these political strategies and the candidates who hope to fulfill them.
