Washington, D.C., October 6, 1992 -- As the general election campaign intensifies, C-SPAN announces plans for the upcoming Presidential and Vice Presidential debates. C-SPAN's signature debate coverage will include complete, uninterrupted, live coverage with no commentary or editorializing special archival debate footage courtesy of NBC; live open phone segments following each debate; and five re-airings on average of each debate within a 12-hour time period, allowing west coast viewers a prime time look at the event in its entirety.
