This morning I have been watching C-SPAN's rebroadcast of last Friday's hearing by the Banking Committee and as usual have been very impressed by the business-like way Chairman Gonzalez conducts the seemingly endless investigations of this tangled web.

I especially appreciated Jim Slattery's pointing out that George Bush is no expert on foreign policy, and Mr. Slattery was correct in affirming that "Yes, all of us do have a political interest [in the best sense of the word] in getting to the bottom of this affair."

The whole history of this unfortunate policy, from the removal of Iraq from the terrorist list in 1982, the attack on an American ship, and the gassing of 5,000 innocent people, was very clearly outlined-- followed by the post-Gulf War policy of export of dual-use items, the misuse of agricultural loans, the collusion of Baker, Mosbacher, Yeutter, Eagleberger et al. in "It didn't work, so how do we cover it up?".

Thanks to C-SPAN, PBS, PBR, CNN and the New York Times, as well as my visit to Washington last year under the "Close Up" program, I have maintained my respect for those members of Congress, such as yourself, Henry Gonzalez and John Kerry and others in the dogged pursuit of the truth and in restoring the integrity of the United States.
