Dear Concerned Citizen:

I have just been informed by my local cable service that my access to C-SPAN has been restricted. I will no longer be able to watch and become an informed citizen because they have preempted the evening hours and morning hours and now only present C-SPAN mid-day or the middle of the night. I find this extremely upsetting. I feel my ability to become informed by senatorial, congressional, and any/all learned persons has been deeply impaired. C-SPAN has given me the most indepth and non-slanted information I can find. I love Brian Lamb's discussions especially because I have NEVER seen him, in any way, show any favoritism nor make any effort to persuade or manipulate listeners. In this way I feel I can make my own informed decision. There is no other media, I feel, can present the cases and the people involved and let me make the decision.

I am writing to inform you of the censorship that has been imposed upon myself. I am writing to ask for your help and support. I am writing to ask how I can request help, support toward my goal of receiving C-SPAN through my cable service. I am asking why when we have many news stations, cartoon stations, sensational talk shows, sitcoms and old movie stations they have chosen to remove C-SPAN.

I was told by my cable service that it was a congressional law that has imposed this censorship. I have requested a copy of this law. I would like to know who voted for this law. I would like to know the name of the person/persons that choose to remove C-SPAN from my cable service. What I want most is to have total and complete access to C-SPAN.

I am sending a copy of this letter to all News Papers, Congress Persons, Senators, The President of the United States (Hillary) Radio Stations, the F.C.C. and anyone I feel might help me with this cause.
