Wonderful Coverage of the New Hampshire Primary,

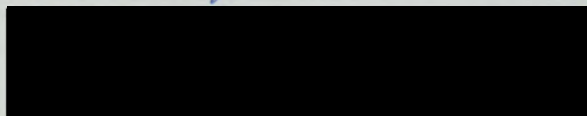
The Womth of Home.
