I sincerely enjoy your programs on C-Span, but I want to see an African-American woman in a key position on the air after 6 p.m. in the evening.

Please have a round-table discussion on the following topic:

Did the Black Power Movement provide opportunities for middle-class African-Americans, or was it affirmative action?
