

Dear Mr. Murphy:

I am writing to express my concern about the presidential debates. I feel the decision making process determining participation isn't fair, and does not reflect the democratic process. Why are debates dominated by the two major parties excluding third or independent party candidates?

Major party candidates have greater access to free media exposure, and the commission on Presidential Debates clearly favors Republican and Democratic candidates.

There are millions of us that believe any candidate that has accomplished ballot access (as has Dr. John Hagelin) has a right to be heard and included in the debates.

I strongly urge you to guarantee that Dr. John Hagelin, who has practical, proven solutions to the nation's problems, be included in the presidential debates. (see attached for background).

INTRODUCTION

BACKGROUND

The Natural Law Party of the United States of America was formed on April 20, 1992, in Fairfield, Iowa—the heartland of America. The Party was established to “bring the light of science into politics”—to introduce the most up-to-date and effective solutions to the nation’s problems.
