I am enclosing a copy of a letter I sent to Mr. Steve Ballmer, President of Microsoft Corp. I have been interesting furthering the cause of higher education for most of my life. I originally thought that Mr. Bill Gate's, and still do, would be interested in building a university in honor of his name and achievements. My prayers tell me that your name and achievements would also be excellant for promoting the cause of higher education and for the founding a new institution of higher learning.

Has it been 100 years since we have used the name of a president for the creation of a new university. George Washington University in Washington D.C. Is the last university that I know of that was founded in the name of a president. The new millennium would be a perfect time to reflect on the achievements of a president, congress and a society as a whole and to think about the possibly that a new school can and should be built to reflect on those achievements.

For that reason, I am placing your name at the forefront of a movement to create a new school of higher learning.
