## C-SPAN OFFERS AN INSIDE LOOK AT THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

- Week-long Series Encompasses All Aspects Of The Agency -

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- C-SPAN cameras will provide cable viewers with an in-depth focus on the Federal Bureau of Investigation - the nation's premier investigative agency - February 9-12th. Over four consecutive evenings, different aspects of the agency will be explored: the history, agent training, day-to-day activities, and recent events that fall within the agency's jurisdiction. Fifteen first-run programming hours culminate with a live viewer call-in program with FBI Director William Webster on Tuesday, February 17.

Each evening at 7:00 pm EST, C-SPAN telecasts include interviews with present and former FBI staff, journalists who have covered the agency, a visit to the training facilities in Quantico, VA, and viewer call-in programs with the four Executive Assistant Directors under William Webster, live from FBI headquarters in Washington, DC. Each day's programming package will re-air at 1:00 am that night.

C-SPAN's FBI special begins Monday, February 9 with a history of the Bureau and an examination of its relationship with Congress. Programming is comprised of an interview with Jack French, former FBI agent and former head of the Research Unit; a roundtable discussion with journalists who have covered the FBI; an interview with Rep. Don Edwards (D-CA), a former FBI agent; and a live viewer call-in program from FBI headquarters with Bill Baker, assistant director for FBI public relations.

Tuesday's telecast, taped on-location at the agency's training facilities in Quantico, VA, looks at three areas of agent training: classroom situation, physical, and firearms training, as well as a visit to the Behavior Science Unit, which examines the psychological makeup of criminals. C-SPAN wraps up Tuesday's programming with a live viewer call-in program with James Greenleaf, Assistant Director, Training Division.

Wednesday's coverage of the FBI's recent investigations includes a series of interviews with four members of the Criminal Division and James Geer, head of the Intelligence Division. Oliver Revell, Executive Assistant Director of the Investigations Division, answers viewer questions at 9:30 pm EST.

Thursday's programming focuses on different aspects of the agency's day-to-day activities. C-SPAN explores the agency's stolen art file and gun collection during interviews with special agents of the FBI's Laboratory Division. An examination of FBI technology shows viewers how handwriting analyses and drug tests are conducted. Then, at 9:30 pm EST, Executive Assistant Directors John Otto and John Glover take viewer calls about these law enforcement services of the FBI.
