Analysis, National Public Opinion on Events As They Occur

Washington, D.C., August 22 -- C-SPAN will devote several hours a day in the coming weeks to special coverage of the Persian Gulf crisis. Interviews and live Call-ins will provide viewers with an open forum to debate events on a minute-by-minute basis.

C-SPAN's Mideast crisis programming airs Monday - Friday, starting at 3:00 PM (ET), and will re-air weeknights at 8:00 PM (ET). This coverage will continue until Tuesday, September 4, the day before the return of the U.S. House of Representatives.

Guests such as ambassadors, journalists, and U.S. government officials will face the phone lines and offer perspective on the changing situation.

Topics will include all breaking news events and the issues surrounding the crisis, such as the role of the United Nations, U.S. military options, the future of OPEC, and media coverage of events.
