

EDITOR'S NOTE: [REDACTED] immigrant from Greece as a teenager, is a prominent American patriot and philanthropist. She holds an honorary doctorate in humane letters from Christopher Newport College. She was the sponsor, christener, and honoree at the commissioning of, the guided missile cruiser U.S.S. Yorktown. The Valley Forge Foundation named Mrs. [REDACTED] winner of its George Washington award.

At the 200th anniversary celebration in 1981 on the battlefields of the Yorktown victory that won the American Revolution, the White House seated [REDACTED] "beside President Ronald Reagan and President Mitterand of France.

In 1992 the American Hellenic society AHEPA named her first female winner of its Socrates award. Last year local, state and national groups joined on "[REDACTED] Day" to award her 22 engraved plaques in thanks for her philanthropies.

Since [REDACTED] and her late husband [REDACTED] founded [REDACTED] [REDACTED] at Yorktown VA in 1944, the restaurant has grown in size from 35 to 435 seats. [REDACTED] still is owner and stand-up cashier, full time, every day. 
