You will attend a number of special functions held in your honor, including a presentation on the Floor of the House of Representatives and a special White House issue briefing.

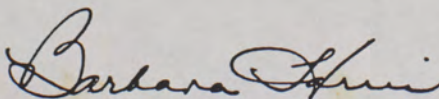
At the end of the Conference you will receive the prestigious National Youth Leadership Certificate of Merit.

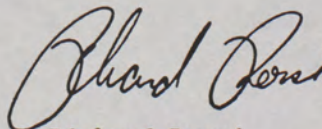
Upon your acceptance into the National Young Leaders Conference your representative and senators will be notified, as well as local news media in your area.

P.S. Returning the enclosed reply card does not obligate you or your parents in any way, but we must receive your card postmarked no later than July 19th.

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Selection

Fewer than two percent of all secondary school students nationwide are eligible to serve as Congressional Scholars. Students may be nominated only by their school principal or directly by the Congressional Youth Leadership Council.

You were nominated directly by the Council based on information we received from national scholastic services which collect academic information and conduct pre-college classroom surveys to assist educational institutions in identifying promising students.

Cost

Each attending Scholar pays \$695 which covers all costs, except lunches, while in Washington. Scholars are also responsible for travel to and from our nation's capital.

If you require financial assistance, the Congressional Youth Leadership Council has prepared a special book to help you raise the necessary funds within your community. In addition, Council staff have been assigned to support you in your fundraising efforts. Additional information on community fundraising will be sent upon receipt of the enclosed reply card.

Staff

The National Young Leaders Conference is directed by a full time staff of professional educators. All Scholars are supervised 24 hours a day from the moment they arrive, by professional faculty advisors and staff, at a ratio of 1 to 17. A registered nurse is on call at all times.

The Congressional Youth Leadership Council

The Congressional Youth Leadership Council is a non-profit, non-political educational organization with over 340 members of the United States Senate and House of Representatives on its bipartisan advisory board.

The purpose of the National Young Leaders Conference is to identify and honor a select group of exceptional high school students and allow them the opportunity to witness history in the making; to meet the leaders who fundamentally affect the workings of the executive, legislative and judicial branches of the federal government; and to bring to life the American constitutional process.
