Re: Non-coverage of the 1993 Libertarian Party Convention

Dear Mr. Lamb:

I am writing as I don't understand why the first showing of the Libertarian Party convention program was cut off before the end of the panel, about 7 minutes later (Sun. Sept. 5, 5:21pm-5:28pm). The repeats after the first showing showed the whole thing. Why was this done on the first showing on Sun. Sept. 5, 4pm-5:21pm (ET)? I have NEVER seen C-SPAN cut off a hearing or seminar unless it would have run into the House of Representatives which you say is a priority. Why did C-SPAN do it this time?

I also want to know why the Libertarian Party's convention was not covered more fully? There were many panel discussions or seminars and topics C-SPAN could have easily covered, as C-SPAN had a crew there. C-SPAN only chose to cover the one on "Libertarian Elected Officials." C-SPAN could have shown many of them instead of all the repeat showings of the other seminars and interviews that were shown previously. I am enclosing a copy of all the panel discussions C-SPAN could have shown. All C-SPAN had to do was make a choice on the ones that were held at the same time. That still would have left C-SPAN many to tape and show, live or on taped delay.

C-SPAN said after the last convention in 1991, that it was interested in covering the next one. Well, C-SPAN didn't really do it with just the one seminar C-SPAN did show. I would like an explanation and to find out if C-SPAN will cover more completely the next presidential convention with most of the seminars, scheduled tentatively for the summer of 1996, place yet unknown.
