American war in Vietnam was just

Dear Editor:

Molly Ivins stated in a recent column: "Odd but appropriate that as we celebrate the 50th anniversary of our victory in the good war, we shall also be reminded of the one we mucked up" ... also a comment from Robert McNamara ... "We were wrong, terribly wrong."

So the good war is, that we fought, "Nazi aggression," and "mucked up" the bad war that was "Communist aggression."

Let me state some facts about aggression:

In 1954, the Geneva Agreement was signed to separate North and South Vietnam, along the 17th parallel.

Communist sympathizers who had gone north after partition began returning south in increasing numbers. Called "Vietcong," they began launching attacks on U.S. military installations that had been established, and in 1958 began their attacks on the Diem Government.

The attacks continued throughout the following year and were intensified in 1960, the year in which North Vietnam openly proclaimed its intention "to liberate South Vietnam from the ruling yoke of the U.S. imperialists and their henchmen."

On August 7, 1964, the U.S. Congress passed Tonkin Resolution, authorizing presidential action in Vietnam, after North Vietnam boats reportedly attacked two U.S. destroyers on Aug. 2, 1964.

So corrupt Communist aggression is OK and Nazi aggression is not? Is that what is being said? ... that aggression is not the same if it is the aggression of the Communists.

from North Vietnam? If men, women and children are being slaughtered, and villages are being burned to the ground, is it somehow a different corrupt aggression? Twelve million skeletons were found in the early 1990's on the Cambodia and North Vietnam borders. Evidence shows it was the North Vietnam who was responsible for these crimes.

So that means that all the anti-war demonstrations during the '60s was OK?, and the anti-war demonstrations in 1938, '39, '40 and 1941 were not?

The ROTC and other government buildings were being blown up in the 1960s, so that is OK, or is it evil?

Now let us look at, "we were wrong, terribly wrong." Robert McNamara had to be talking about the statement he made on March 19, 1982, when he was World Bank president:

"Over population and rapid demographic growth of Mexico is already today one of the major threats to the national security of the United States. We will be up to our necks in Mexicans for whom we cannot find jobs."

... (The New Federalist Magazine, May 1994, Page 13.) Do you believe this, over population in Mexico is a threat to the security of the United States?

I thought it was the 38,000 atomic weapons that the Russian Communists still possess. I thought that when you defend a country that is the victim of aggression, it was a virtue?

Let us go back to 1942 when Pope Pius XII made this statement condemning indifference:

"When a country is the victim of aggression its people cannot remain passively indifferent if it would act as befits Christians. All the more does the solidarity of the family of nations forbid others to act as mere spectators in apathetic neutrality."

Does Communism fit the charge that Patrick Henry made over 20 years ago?:

"It is impossible that a nation of infidels or idolaters should be a nation of free men. It is when a people forget God that tyrants forge their chains."

At a convention in 1775, he said:

"I know not what course others may take, but as for me, give me liberty or give me death."

Legitimate defense can be not only a right but a grave duty for someone responsible for another's life, the common good of the family or of the state ... (Catechism of the Catholic Church," Page 545.)
