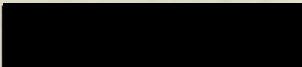
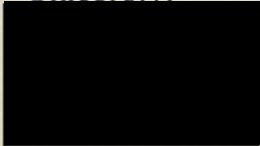
Dear Mr. Lamb:

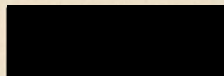

C-Span is an important and essential addition to our society, please don't let it be for Elitists and Big Deals.

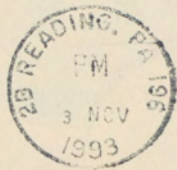
