



## BELGIAN RELIEF MEDAL

The medal was minted during the period of World War I to promote funds for Belgian food relief. One small medal was intended to be sold for the cost to feed a Belgian child for one month. Since Germany was occupying Belgium at the time, transportation of the medals from the country was interrupted. The original quantity of medals that were struck is not known.

Obverse: King Albert and Queen Elisabeth of Belgium are featured. "LL" refers to Lordships and "MM" refers to Their Majesties.

Reverse: Columbia symbolizes America and is featured feeding a Belgian family with bread from her apron.

Designer: Godefroid DeVreese, Brussels, Belgium, 1914.

Medal Content: Silver plated over a brass base.
