The Four Corners Pipeline have been allowed to install a Booster Pump by the County of San Bernardino. There were no advanced notices, no public hearings, etc. What about fire, oil spill, Environmental Impact Study, ruination of our lives, etc. They plan to run the pump 365 days a year, 24 hours a day.

They ran the pump at night on September 30, 1993 and we were unable to sleep. We had to close the doors and windows, sleep in our front room and have the TV on all night. We were advised by the District Attorney to get a lawyer and file an injunction against the company. 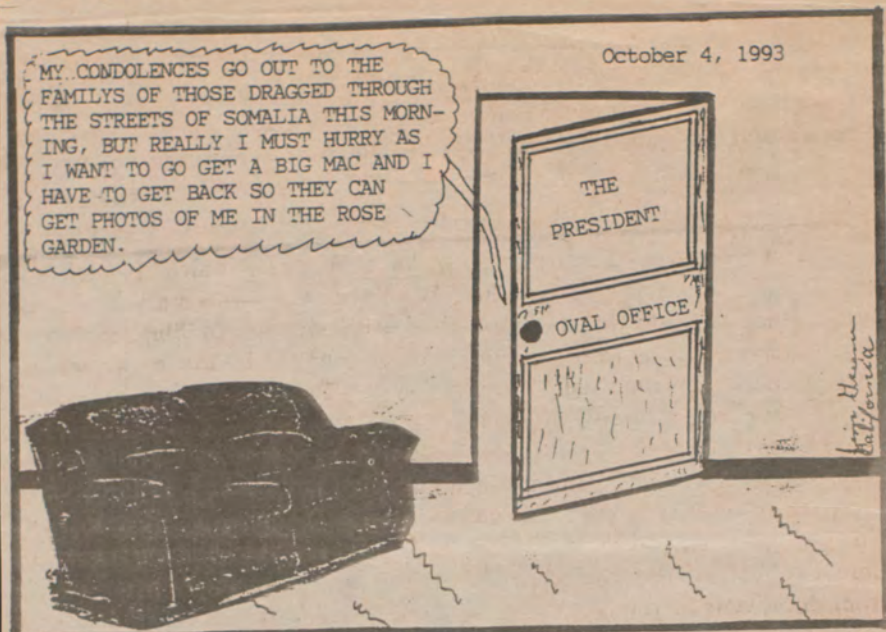
But there is one hero head and but-tocks above them all. One all our children should be taught to emulate for it is our children who will inherit this nation or what will be left of this great nation three years hence.
